The needs of the new people vary widely from previous abusive church situations, homelessness, homosexuality, a recent suicide attempt, and amnesia. Each story is different and precious to our Saviour. Please pray that the Lord would reach each one in his or her place of need.

Please pray that the Lord would prepare elders so that the church will be able to have an elder election next year (there will be three candidates, Lord willing). The membership class will finish up by mid-July, and they expect to have some new people welcomed into membership before the end of the summer.

The rainy season has brought some damage to some furnishings in the church building. Please pray that the more valuable items such as the piano and sound equipment will be preserved from the rain. Please pray that the Lord would see fit to provide the funds for the purchase of a new building.

Finally, pray that the Lord would bless in every aspect of the Boyles' Canadian deputation in the fall.
