He also had the honor of participating in the ordination ceremony of the first ruling elders of the church in Mexico City. Following that, he attended the Week of Prayer in Greenville.

He thanks the Lord that during his absence, his congregation in Santo Domingo was able to meet in person and to listen to a recorded message for the preaching of the Word on Sunday. The church is thankful that they were able to purchase and install air conditioning for the church sanctuary. It has given them great relief to be able to worship without discomfort in the increasing heat.

The church services continue to be well attended and some people have shown interest in visiting. Ramón continues with discipleship classes on Mondays, and they will soon have new candidates for baptism and church membership.

The church has transitioned to its new interim session composed of Rev. Jason

Boyle, Rev. Jorge Eduardo Peña, and ruling elder Óscar Vargas. The church thanks Rev. Derrick Bowman and Rev. Armen Thomassian for their service as the first interim session of the Word of Life Free Presbyterian Church.

Mexico City—Jason & Danielle Boyle

The Boyles are encouraged and spurred on by Galations 6:9: "And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not." The process of training and preparing men to serve requires much busyness before it turns into delegation. The Boyles are still in the midst of the busyness, but they say they are thankful that the Lord has put their hands to this work and they wouldn't have it any other way.

In May three men in the Mexico City church were ordained to eldership: Oscar Vargas, Leonardo Guiterrez, and Genaro Romero. The church welcomed a delegation of five men from the presbytery for this occasion: Reverends Larry Saunders, Eduardo (Lalo) Peña, Ramón Sosa, Derrick Bowman, and John Wagner. During their visit, Larry and Ramón were able to make the trip to Córdoba, Veracruz, (where Lalo pastors) and to Tehuacán, Puebla, (where Jair pastors) to preach. The newly ordained elders and Jason will be conducting a series of membership interviews next week. They praise God for more people who wish to join the church.

In recent months they have seen a number of signs that God is working in hearts. Sirani and her boyfriend, Alonso, are seeking the Lord and desire to walk correctly before Him. Victor, the husband of a member in the church, for whose salvation they have prayed for many years, recently met with Jason to tell him that he is being convicted of sin for the first time in his life. Elena, a recent single mother, is now walking in God's steps and seeking to raise her daughter for the Lord. Isaac Cruz, a famous boxer on ESPN, is showing signs that God is working in his heart. He and his girlfriend are very timid, despite having attended the church faithfully for a couple years. Please pray that they will integrate into the church more. Please pray that each one of these people will continue to seek the Lord and be baptized; some have already asked to be baptized.

Jair Aguilar (pastor in Tehuacán) and Wenceslao (pastor in Jalpan de Serra) will be petitioning the presbytery to come under care at the fall Week of Prayer. Wenceslao was providentially able to spend two weeks in Mexico City recently so that his daughter and his sister could have medical appointments. It proved to be a time of encouraging fellowship. The Boyles were able to pass on gifts of clothing and money from the Winston-Salem FPC, which proved to be a very timely help to them

The church has begun to send the seminary students and elders on a regular basis to visit the sister churches to preach and encourage the congregations and pastors. It is proving to be helpful on a personal level and congregational level. Now that Rubén has graduated from seminary, the presbytery determined that he and his wife, Cinthya, should go to the Dominican Republic to serve in Ramón Sosa's church for approximately one year, for Rubén's internship.

Please pray much for each congregation and the seminary students, as they continue to work on forming a Latin American Presbytery. This involves bringing each church to the point of constitution and its pastor to ordination in the FPCNA. There are currently three constituted churches, one mission church, two men who will be petitioning to come under care of the presbytery, and two churches that hope to become mission churches in the future.

The Boyles' work in the Mexico City church continues with a monthly Bible study for newly married women and young moms, a bi-monthly women's breakfast, and four other studies currently that Jason is doing with different groups of people. Plans are developing to have a bi-monthly men's breakfast as well.

In May they began to add on a Sunday school room, to partially enclose the kitchen, and to add a men's bathroom. The renovations should be completely finished soon. Other touch ups already done include a new fridge, making a new piano cover, a new hanging verse behind the pulpit, and a burning bush pulpit fall. Providentially, one of the members is starting a business with an embroidery machine and was able to make the pulpit fall, which turned out beautifully. More are also being made for the other Latin American constituted works. The church's current urgent need is for air conditioning units for the sanctuary and Sunday school rooms. They look to the Lord who knows the need.

They are adapting their current space for the church's needs, but know that to best serve the growing church and denomination a permanent building and property are needed. They wait on the Lord to open the way.

Upcoming events that need to be covered much in prayer: 1) VBS July 22–26; 2) a mission trip at the beginning of August to their most needy sister church in La Escalera where Pepe pastors; and 3) the upcoming Latin American Family Week of Prayer in Jalpan de Serra at the beginning of July (the number of people present will be expanding since they will be welcoming the new elders and their families into this special time of fellowship).

Lalo Peña thanks God for the opportunity to attend the Week of Prayer in Greenville in May. He says it was a time of enormous edification, fellowship, and encouragement from the Word preached, the times of prayer, and the matters discussed during the business sessions.
