They successfully got moved out of their house after many visits to charity shops and attempts to find storage space for the rest at their parents' houses! The family set off for Kenya early in the morning of September 23 and arrived in Nairobi late that night.

During their four-day stay in Nairobi, Glenn's work permit was approved, which meant he could get the relevant paperwork completed, stamped, and collected before leaving the city to travel on to Kitale. The timing worked out perfectly and is a matter for which God is to be thanked.

On their first day in Kitale, the congregations of Glory Bible Church organized a welcome service for the Hamiltons attended by many from across the congregations in Western Kenya. The Kenyans went to great lengths to show their love and support for the Hamiltons as they begin their work for the Lord together.

Since that time, it's been important to take time to settle into things slowly. Glenn has been able to oversee in person the ongoing refurbishment work in the larger house on the missionary compound, which when complete, will become the Hamilton family home. Emma has re-started the homeschool routine and experimented with some of the new cooking ingredients she now has at her disposal!

Holly, George, and Isabella have adjusted well to the changes so far and are very happy in their new environment. They like to go gecko spotting in the garden and to climb the many trees around the compound.

After some more time is spent settling in, getting routines in place, and establishing themselves in the country, the Hamiltons will focus on Swahili practice, on visiting each of the congregations, and on planning for training and outreach activities alongside the members of GBC.

Please pray: 1) that the remaining paperwork will be completed in coming weeks to allow the family to be formally resident in Kenya and have access to all the necessary services; 2) that refurbishment work continues as scheduled allowing the Hamiltons to move into their long-term home soon; 3) that relationships continue to strengthen with local people generally, and with the members of Glory Bible Church; 4) that language learning will accelerate with practical experience in-country; 5) for Glenn as he begins to get involved in the affairs of Glory Bible Church leadership and in training of men for upcoming office-bearer elections; 6) for Emma as

she sets up new routines in a new home, all while working around the new Kenyan quirks—such as regular power cuts! 7) for Holly, George, and Isabella as they continue exploring Kenya, that in spite of language differences, they will quickly make new friends.
