On July 26, the Paynesville Free Presbyterian Mission Church sponsored its annual Liberian Independence Day children's program with over 115 children in attendance. This ministry began several years ago in an effort to get children off the streets during what can be a dangerous time amid all the "celebrations" of the national holiday. Mr. Nathan Barco organizes this annual event.

The church has planned a VBS for August 4–8 and will have a good number of children in attendance for that event. Please continue to pray for Nathan as he leads the other children's workers and teaches the Bible lessons, memory verses, and songs. He has a strong burden to minister the gospel effectively to the children in the surrounding area of the church.

Pastor Moses Dahn is continuing to preach at all the meetings. Please pray for his wife, who has been battling an infection in her lower legs and feet. She has been in a lot of pain and has trouble walking as a result. Some recent medical treatments have seemed to help a little, but she is still battling the infection. Pastor Dahn is also managing the bookstore, which continues to sell many Bibles. In the latest report sent to Mr. Bowman, they sold 38 Bibles in a ten-day period.

Another encouragement at the church is that a man in the congregation donated paint and his labor to paint the interior walls of the church, which were just bare plastered cement. The painting was a nice aesthetic upgrade and helps reduce the dust from off the walls. The folks in the congregation were very appreciative of this man's generosity. His effort is another token for good that the Lord has provided to demonstrate that the people in the congregation are working together to advance the cause of Christ in the area.

The men at LTBS in Ulster continue to manage the radio station. Several people in Liberia have reported to Mr. Bowman that the programming is good and the radio signal is loud and clear. The radio station is an important ministry, and many people listen to 92.5 Free Presbyterian Radio basically all day long. Continue to pray for Mr. Philip Irwin in Ulster as he puts the programming together.

Like Glenn, Emma also finished preparing a ladies' meeting message in Swahili and has had the opportunity to speak at both the Tantana and Shimo la Tewa Ladies' Fellowships. This milestone is an answer to the prayers of God's people. Glenn and Emma thank you for your support and request that you keep praying for language progress.

As of this week, the homeschool program for the year has finished. While some days have been easier than others, Emma has enjoyed her first year as a homeschool teacher, and both Holly and George seem to have enjoyed it too—at least most of the time! They will break for the month of August before starting the new year in September.

One of the reasons for the August break is to welcome a mission team from Northern Ireland, which will arrive on August 1 to help with VBS and youth programs for two weeks. A lot of preparation work has been done already. Please pray for all that will take place during the team's visit.

The Hamiltons praise God for one major answer to prayer, in the form of Elizabeth Edwards' arrival in Kenya on July 1. Since then, she's been settling into the new routines in a new environment, but she will share more about all of that in her own update below.
